C. On the back of this paper, explain the purpose of the Chinese Exclusion Act and the Gentlemen's Agreement. Chinese Exclusion Act excluded Chinese immigrants starting in 1882 for 10 years, then it was revisited and continued until 1892, then until 1903. Exceptions- students, teachers, merchants.
Gentlemen's Agreement - Japanese school children in SF were segregated, Japan protested, President Roosevelt stepped in to broker the Gentlemen's Agreement which limited Japanese workers to America in exchange for desegregation.
